A genealogical conference focusing on Portuguese research has been planned to include lectures, computer lab time, one-on-one guided research, as well as allowing time for general research in the Family History Library (FHL). Lecture topics include computer databases as well as basic techniques for beginners. The FHL has records from all over the world, including church and civil records from Portugal and its regions. Other genealogical records include ship passenger lists, census records, World War I & II draft registrations, and birth, marriage, and death records. If you can, plan additional days before or after the conference for more research time. Do not miss this opportunity to research at the world's greatest genealogical research library.

The conference includes lecture sessions, computer lab time, conference materials (on CD or flash drive), and personal assistance. Attend as many or as few lectures as applicable to you!

1) Complete the registration form, write your check and drop it the mail (see address below).

2) Reserve a room at the Salt Lake Plaza Hotel (800) 366-3684 or (801) 521-0130. Mention the Azores Genealogy Group for our special group rate of \$92 a night for a standard or \$102 for a deluxe room (U.S. Dollars) plus taxes. LECTURE DESCRIPTIONS

Getting Started in Genealogy and Software Review – A basic overview on filling out charts and forms, collecting information, how to document and cite sources. A genealogy software review is also included.

U.S. Vital Records – How to obtain birth, marriage, death, and baptism records in the United States and how to assess the information therein.

Census and City Directories – An overview on what can be found on which censuses, tips on locating your ancestors on the censuses, how to find city directories and what to expect from them.

Overview of Portuguese Vitals – How the archives and civil registries house the records, what to expect from each type of record for the three time periods, De Genere process, confession rolls, and passaportes.

“Reading” Portuguese Records – How to bumble your way through the records to extract the needed information as well as figuring out the abbreviations and handwriting.

CCA or ABM Web Site – An overview of what is on the *Centro de Conhecimento dos Açores*, how to access it via Tombo.pt, and how to locate records on the site. (Madeirans can access the ABM instead).

Immigrant Sources – An overview of the sources generated by an immigrant: Naturalization, alien registration, Social Security, World War I Draft, American passport records, fraternal societies and lodges/halls, and passenger arrival lists.

Preparing for a Research Trip to the Azores – From airlines that fly to the Azores to what to expect from the archives and civil registries, as well as what to know when you go, will be covered in this lecture.

Navigating the CITCEM-GHP Site – A sociology study with linking pedigrees for Corvo, Pico, Faial (except Castelo Branco, Feteria, and Flamengos) and Ribeira Seca on Sao Jorge. The good, the bad, and the ugly about this useful site.

Unpublished Manuscripts – An overview of the manuscripts on the CCA.

DNA and Genealogy – A basic overview of how DNA works and how it can be used to further genealogical research.

Third Party Tools for DNA – An overview of GedMatch, the Autosomal DNA Segment Analyzer (ADSA), the Autosomal DNA Utility (Utility), and DNA Painter and what can be expect from each.

Creating, Exporting, and Importing GEDCOMs – A brief history of what is GEDCOM, and a brief overview of creating, exporting, and importing Gedcoms from the major genealogy softwares as well as the major cloud based sites.

Thinking Like Sherlock Holmes – By looking at various documents, innovative strategies will be presented that analyze and evaluate the document. Inferences will be made and conclusions will be drawn.

Portuguese-American Digital Newspaper Collections – Tips and tricks to locating items of interest in Portuguese language newspapers. Information comes from Portuguese communities all over, mainly New England, California, and Hawaii.

Getting the Most Out of Your FTDNA Page - A tour of your personal web page including what sections to fill out to maximize the responses you will receive from your matches.

DNA Mish Mash – A look at some of the more in-depth and scientific topics of DNA.

Find A Grave – Learn how to join Find A Grave, search, create memorials as well as adding others, requesting and taking photos, and creating your own virtual cemetery!

Reverse Genealogy – Learn how to use sources from your own genealogy searches and apply them to trace forward to possibly find living cousins today.

Utilizing the Trees of Others – How to use the trees of your genealogy matches and incorporate their lines into your own tree.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES



Rosemarie Capodicci has been researching her Italian and Portuguese genealogy since 1979 and published the quarterly newsletter for Portuguese genealogists called "*Portuguese Ancestry*" for 14 years, ending in January 2005. She has also written a column for the Monterey County Genealogical Society's newsletter called the "*Portuguese Corner*." Rosemarie has lectured on Portuguese research at the 1995 National Genealogical Conference in San Diego, the DAR/FHC Seminars in Seaside, California since 1991, the San Francisco History Fair for three years, the annual S.H.H.A.R. (Hispanic Conference) in 1993 and 1995, many genealogy societies in California, as well as Monterey County Genealogical Society's Seminars. She has also lectured at the Azores Conference in Salt Lake City. Rosemarie has also been a library assistant for the Monterey Branch Family History Center since 1989.



Cheri Mello has been a researcher for over 25 years and has traced many of her ancestral lines (both American and Portuguese) into the 1700s and a few lines beyond that. Over the years she has been a member of various Portuguese genealogical societies. She was the lead moderator for America Online's Genealogy Forum, hosting the Portuguese chat for nine years. After that, she moderated on Lusaweb before founding her own Azores list on Google Groups in 2005, which now has about 2000 members. She has been an administrator with Family Tree DNA on the Azores project for over 10 years. She has lectured all over the greater Los Angeles area, as well as in Santa Barbara, Ventura, Riverside, San Bernardino, and San Diego counties in CA as well as in New Bedford, MA, North Dartmouth, MA, and Providence, RI. In addition to lecturing on Portuguese genealogy, she has also lectured on DNA, GEDCOMs, Find A Grave, and more.
