Minister Bogollagama Meets Ambassadors In Middle East



Bogollagama will meet his country's heads of missions in the GCC countries, Iran, Israel and Jordan in Dubai on January 14 and 15.

Besides Ambassadors and Deputy Heads of Mission, the two-day meeting will be attended by representatives from the Sri Lanka Tea Board, Sri Lanka Tourist Board, Ministry of Labor Welfare and Promotion, Board of Investment and Sri Lanka Bureau of Foreign Employment.

The inaugural address will be delivered by the Minister, while the participating Ambassadors will be given an opportunity to make a presentation to exchange ideas among the missions. The formal program will be followed by a series of lectures by SLBFE officials on the job market in the Middle East, opportunities available in the Middle East and welfare of the island's overseas workers. The Foreign Ministry has also arranged one on one meeting between Minister Bogollagama and Heads of Missions.

RIYADH – In association with the Sri Lankan community, the Sri Lankan Missions in the Kingdom have made elaborate arrangements to celebrate its country's national day Wednesday, Feb 4. Arrangements are being chalked out by an Organizing Committee headed by Ambassador Marleen.

The Sri Lankan Embassy in Riyadh will host a breakfast morning for all Sri Lankans in Riyadh following the ceremonial flag hoisting ceremony. Ambassador A.A.M Marleen will unfurl the national flag amid the beat of drums at 9 am at the Embassy premises. The community members will join the choir of the Sri Lankan International School in Riyadh to recite the National Anthem. This will be followed by the recital of Jayamangala Gaatha and observance of two-minute silence by the audience in memory of fallen heroes.

The traditional oil lamp will be lit by the Ambassador, Diplomats and prominent community members to mark the day. The envoy is slated to make his Independence Day speech at the end of the morning program. Sabarullah Khan, Deputy Chief of \mission, Yasanthe De Silva Commercial Secretary and Labor Counselor Ranawake will read out the messages of President Mahinda Rajapakse, Prime Minister Ratnasiri Wickremanayake and Foreign Minister Rohitha Bogollagama during the morning function. Religious dignitaries from all faiths will also pray for the progress and prosperity of the nation.

In the evening, Ambassaor Marleen and his wife Fathima will host a reception to Diplomats, Government Officials, well-wishers and prominent members of the island's community at the Tuwaiq Palace in the Diplomatic Quarter. 

Heritance Ahungalle, (formerly known as Triton), has become a popular attraction for Middle Eastern tourists who have been visiting Sri Lanka in large numbers in recent years.

It is one of the legendary Geoffrey Bawa architectural fantasies that has been turned to life....where the uninterrupted line of sky merging with the sea, gives the illusion of a continuous flow right into the azure waters that surround it. This gives way to slender white columns rising majestically from the courtyard into the elegant marbled lobby where a warm welcome awaits the visitor.

Every dimension - is magnified here to create an aura of freedom, as if to provide release from the fetters of the outside world to meander through quiet corridors, luxurious rooms and elegant restaurants of contrasting textures, materials and earthy colors where architecture and nature blend comfortably to please the eye and the senses.

Renowned artist, Laki Senanayake's painstakingly magical tracery in charcoal, of liana reminiscent of the Sinharaja forest, climbs lazily along the staircase wall from floor to ceiling and spreads its tendrils like a fine lace curtain, Its undulating curves contrasting sharply with the angles of the carpeted black and tan stairway ~ shades of Bawa and Senanayake at their best ...

The 'Mustard', a 24-hour coffee-shop, overlooks the pool and on certain evenings a flare illuminates a lone flautist from his vantage point in a fishing boat moored on the water, adding his incredibly haunting but plaintively sweet contribution to a leisurely meal and a tranquil evening.


