Kandy: The Capital In The Hills



Kandy, is the English name for the city of *Maha Nuvara* (Senkadagalapura) in the central hill country of Sri Lanka. It is the capital of the Central Province and Kandy District. It lies in the midst of hills in the Kandy Valley which crosses an area of tropical plantations, mainly tea. Kandy is one of the most scenic cities in Sri Lanka.

The city is of both an administrative and religious significance. The name Kandy is derived from the Sinhalese $ka^nda\ uda\ pas\ rata$, literally "the five districts on the mountain".

The Portuguese shortened this to "Candea", using the name for both the kingdom and its capital Senkadagalapura. In Sinhala, Kandy is called *Maha Nuvara* (pronounced [maha nuvere]), meaning "Great City" or "Capital", although this is most often shortened to *Nuvara*.

Historical records suggest that Kandy was first established by the King Wickramabahu (1357-1374 CE) near the Watapuluwa area, north of the present city, and named *Senkadagalapura* at the time, although some scholars suggest the name *Katubulu Nuwara* may also have been used.

Kandy is also popular because of the annual festival and pageant known as the Kandy Esala Perahera which involves several days of pomp and grand processions through the streets of the city.

Vehicle Imports For Overseas Workers

The Department of Import and Export Control in Sri Lanka have announced a scheme for the import of vehicles for expatriates under the Foreign Exchange Earned Abroad Program. The scheme allows the import of vehicles by Sri lankan's working overseas who have earned and remitted foreign exchange back to Sri Lanka.

Details of the Scheme are as follows:-MOTOR VEHICLES 3.5-5 YEARS OLD

- Vehicle should be registered in the name of the applicant and used by him for a minimum of ONE year
- Vehicle should not be older than 5
 years from its first date of registration
- A License Fee of 3% of the CIF value of the vehicle is payable

MOTOR VEHICLES 5-10 YEARS OLD

- Vehicle should be registered in the name of the applicant and used by him for a minimum of THREE years
- Vehicle should not be older than 10 years from its first date of registration
- A License Fee of 6% of the CIF value of the vehicle is payable See page 3

Sudden Deaths: Compensation Paid To Expat Families

Foreign Minister Rohitha Bogollagama distributed compensation cheques under the fourth stage to 11 close relatives of those died while they were serving abroad.

Minister Bogollagama handed over the cheques to the families of the victims at a ceremony held at his Ministry.

The compensation was paid to the families of those were employed in Kuwait, Oman, Saudi Arabia and Qatar.

Minister Bogollagama addressing the gathering after handing over the compensation cheques to the victims' families said his Ministry is committed not only to safeguard the privileges and the rights of the migrant workers but also to look into the needs of their relatives in Sri Lanka.

There are nearly 1.2 million migrant workers in the Middle East countries and they are contributing to Rs. 2.5 billion to Sri Lanka's national economy every year.

He said that nearly two million Sri Lankans are residing in foreign countries out of them some have obtained citizenship of those countries. The Foreign Ministry has a bounden duty to look into their grievances, Minister Bogollagama added.

He said a few authorities have a giant responsibility to cater to those. He said some underage children have been sent to foreign countries violating foreign employment regulations.

President Mahinda Rajapaksa has built up a strong foreign policy under which every move has been taken to safeguard those faced with tragedies. Sri Lanka has obtained 100,000 employment opportunities in Libya, the Minister also said.

- Licensee must be present with passport for clearance of vehicle
- Vehicle musty be registered in the name of the Licensee and cannot be transferred in Sri Lanka for 3 years
- Licensee is entitled to import a vehicle, under this scheme, once in five years only

SriLankan Appoints First Lady Captain



SriLankan recently marked a significant milestone in the country's aviation history when Captain Anusha Siriratne was appointed as the National Carrier's first Lady Captain.

Manoj Gunawardena, the airline's CEO, said: "Our heartiest congratulations to Capt. Anusha Siriratne. This is a significant event for the National Carrier. Sri Lanka has been in the forefront of women's empowerment and it is certainly high time that a Sri Lankan woman took command of an airliner."

Interestingly, Capt. Anusha and her husband Capt. Hemantha Siriratne also made history as the first husband-wife pilot duo in the country. Capt. Hemantha received his Captain's appointment earlier this year.

Captain Anusha is modest about her appointment and brushed off her achievement, which had been her childhood ambition.

She also manages her career and her role as a mother very well – her daughter Anika is now five. She took a year off from flying when Anika was born

Capt. Anusha joined SriLankan as a Cadet Pilot in June 1998. She served as a Second Officer on the Lockheed L1011 Tristar fleet, and in 1999 was promoted to First Officer.

A past student of Holy Family Convent, Bambalapitiya and of Ladies College, she obtained her Private Pilot's License at CDE Aviation, and her Commercial Pilot's License in Texas. Prior to joining the National Carrier, she had a short stint as an Instructor at Sky Cabs in Ratmalana.

Anusha is the daughter of the late Zaheer Mohamed and Kerima Mohamed (nee Musafer), from Kollupitiya.

Peoples Bank Launches Forex Deposit Scheme

Sri Lanka's state run People's Bank has started a new foreign exchange deposit scheme .The aim is to open up investment opportunities to non residents interested in investing in Sri Lanka, thereby gaining value for their investment as well as contributing to Sri Lanka's economic Development.

Sri Lankan banks have been allowed to run a separate foreign exchange book earlier with both deposits and loans matched with foreign currency, with depositors allowed to take money out of the country without exchange control restrictions. Under the new scheme, deposits could also be opened in Sri Lanka rupees, which is a high yielding currency or in US Dollars, Sterling Pounds, Euros, Australian Dollars, Canadian Dollars, Hong Kong Dollars, Singapore Dollars, Japanese Yen, Swedish Korners and Swiss Franc with a minimum deposit equal to 10,000 US Dollars.

The new Special Foreign Investment Deposit Accounts, will be open to organizations and persons resident outside Sri Lanka, foreign institutional investors, country funds and mutual funds. The deposits can be placed for 1, 3 ,6 and 12 months for foreign currencies and 3,6 and 12 months for local currency.

Sri Lanka Wins Spirit Of Cricket Award



It was a day to celebrate for the Sri Lankans, as their National cricket team's new arrival Ajantha Mendis became the first Sri Lankan to win the Emerging Player of the Year award at the fifth ICC Awards Ceremony in Dubai on Wednesday. The National team, meanwhile, walked away with the prestigious 'Spirit of Cricket award', presented to the team that has upheld the values of the sport to the maximum. The award was presented to Jayawardene by Tim May, the chief executive of the Federation of International Cricketers' Association (FICA)
